

Parts of SADC are expected to experience temperatures above 35° C over three (3) consecutive days and occasions where temperatures may reach above 40° C during the forecast period of 20 - 26 November 2019.




Figure 1: High temperature forecast for the period 20– 26 November 2019 (Source: <u>SADC-CSC-WRF Model</u>)

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WARNING ZONE




Figure 2: Extreme high temperature forecasted for 20 – 26 November 2019 (Source: <u>SADC-CSC-WRF_Model</u>)

Most of DRC, south-eastern Angola, northern Botswana, central parts of Mozambique, southern Malawi, south and extreme north-east Namibia and south-eastern Zambia have a likelihood to experience extreme temperatures during the period 20 to 26 November 2019 (Figure 2).
