

SADC CLIMATE SERVICES CENTRE (CSC) HEAVY RAINFALL ADVISORY

Issue Number: 1 of 2020/21 Season Release Date: 09/10/2020 FORECAST PERIOD: 09 TO 15 OCTOBER 2020 HIGHLIGHTS HEADLINE: The SADC CSC is forecasting a likelihood of rainfall amounts exceeding 50mm in a 24-hour period in some parts of the SADC region during the period 09 to 15 October 2020.




Figure 1: SADC Region's heavy rainfall advisory for the period 09 to 15 October 2020 (Source: SADC-CSC-WRF GFS Model)

Extreme north-eastern Angola, south-eastern Botswana, most of south-eastern Democratic Republic of Congo, extreme north and eastern United Republic of Tanzania, north-eastern South Africa, central Zambia and northern Zimbabwe have a high probability to receive heavy rainfall above 50mm in 24 hours (Figure 1) during the forecast period from 09 to 15 October 2020. There are indications that rainfall amounts may exceed 100mm (red) over a 24 hours especially in some of these areas. These rains are likely to result in localized flooding in certain areas.
