

## SADC CLIMATE SERVICES CENTRE (CSC) HEAVY RAINFALL ADVISORY

Issue Number: 16 of 2019/20 Release Date: 09/03/2020

FORECAST PERIOD: 09 TO 15 MARCH 2020

**HIGHLIGHTS** 

HEADLINE: The SADC CSC is forecasting a likelihood of rainfall amounts

exceeding 50mm in a 24-hour period in some parts of the SADC

region during the period 09 to 15 March 2020.




Figure 1: SADC Region's heavy rainfall advisory for the period 09 to 15 March 2020 (Source: SADC-CSC-WRF GFS Model)

Central-to-eastern Angola, most of Democratic Republic of Congo, northern Madagascar, Mauritius, central and north-western parts of United Republic of Tanzania, eastern and south-east of South Africa and northern Zambia have a high probability to receive heavy rainfall above 50mm in 24 hours (Figure 1) during the forecast period from 09 to 15 March 2020. There are indications that rainfall amounts may exceed 100mm over a 24 hours especially in northern areas of Madagascar as a consequence of a tropical disturbance currently east of the Island. These rains are likely to result in localized flooding in certain areas.
