



SADC CLIMATE SERVICES CENTRE (CSC) HEAVY RAINFALL ADVISORY

Issue Number: 12 of 2019/20

Release Date: 22/01/2020

FORECAST PERIOD: 22 TO 28 JANUARY 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

HEADLINE: The SADC CSC is forecasting a likelihood of rainfall amounts exceeding 50mm in a 24-hour period in some parts of the SADC region during the period 22 to 28 January 2020.

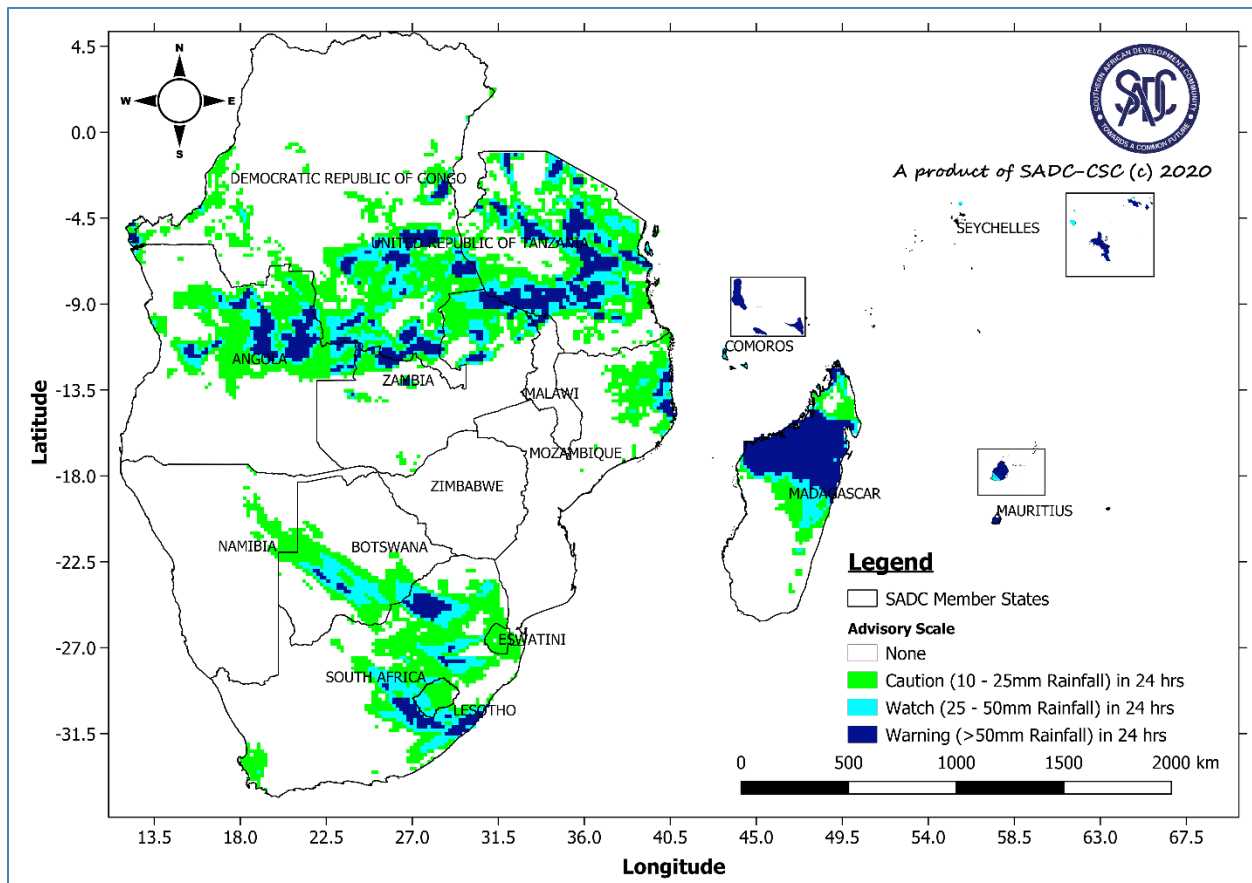


Figure 1: SADC Region's heavy rainfall advisory for the period 22 to 28 January 2020 (Source: SADC-CSC-WRF GFS Model)

North-eastern Angola, south-eastern Democratic Republic of Congo, bulk of central Madagascar, fringes of northern Malawi, north-eastern Mozambique, western Lesotho, northern and coastal parts of South Africa, central parts of United Republic of Tanzania, northern Zambia have a high probability to receive heavy rainfall above 50mm in 24 hours (Figure 1) during the forecast period from 22 to 28 January 2020. These rains are likely to result in localized flooding in certain areas.
