

SADC CLIMATE SERVICES CENTRE (CSC) HEAVY RAINFALL ADVISORY

Issue Number: 9 of 2019/20 Release Date: 31/12/2019

FORECAST PERIOD: 31 DECEMBER 2019 TO 06 JANUARY 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

HEADLINE: The SADC CSC is forecasting a likelihood of rainfall amounts

exceeding 50mm in a 24-hour period in some parts of the SADC

region during the period 31 December 2019 to 06 January 2020.




Figure 1: SADC Region's heavy rainfall advisory for the period 31 December 2019 to 06 January 2020

North eastern Angola, western Botswana, central and eastern Democratic Republic of Congo, western most of Eswatini, eastern Lesotho, northern half of Madagascar, northern Malawi, Mauritius, northern Mozambique, north and eastern Namibia, central and eastern parts of South Africa, southern parts of United Republic of Tanzania, and northern Zambia have a high probability to receive heavy rainfall above 50mm in 24 hours (Figure 1) during the forecast period from 31 December 2019 to 06 January 2020. These rains are likely to result in localized flooding in certain areas.
